



CARRIAGE OF EXPECTANT MOTHER AND INFANTS ON BOARD”

An expectant mother in good health will be accepted for transportation on Alliance Air flights. However, Alliance Air may require expectant mothers to sign documentation as to limitation of liability and indemnity, declaring that Alliance Air shall not be responsible for any liabilities or damages arising from Alliance Air’s carriage of such expectant mothers.

Below are the medical guidelines as per Alliance Air for expectant mothers, which need to be considered at the time of booking.

Pregnancy stage	Pregnancy details	Doctor's certificate requires (Fit to Fly)	MEDIF form required
Up to and including the 28th weeks	Without complications	No	No
Beginning of 29th weeks up to the end of 35th weeks	Single pregnancy without complications	Yes	No
Beginning of 29th week up to end of 32nd week	Multiple or complicated pregnancy	Yes	No
Beginning of 33rd week up to end of 35th week	Multiple or complicated pregnancy	Yes	Yes
Beginning of 36th week and beyond (35 weeks + 1 day and beyond)	<p>Alliance Air cannot accept expectant mothers in their 36th week of pregnancy or beyond for travel.</p> <p>In case of urgent or compassionate grounds In case of pregnancy beyond 35 weeks and beyond, the Customer may be accepted for transportation only on urgent or compassionate grounds, with the authority of the Alliance Air doctor, contact details, after filling the Medical Information Form (“MEDIF”) form.</p>		

New Born Baby:

- An infant for air travel-minimum age is 14 days old. In such cases also, an indemnity has to be obtained from the Customer.
- Exceptionally, for life-saving treatment for the new born, the mother and child can be accepted for travel, before 14 (Fourteen) days, with a medical certificate of the obstetrician and a pediatrician. These Customers have to be accompanied by a doctor.

Medical certificates must include the following information:

- Patient's name and date of birth.
- Estimated date of delivery.
- Confirmation of an uncomplicated single pregnancy or a multiple pregnancy or complicated pregnancy
- Confirmation that patient is "fit to travel" for the entire journey, including return (where applicable).
- Date, stamp and contact details of a registered medical practitioner.

The medical certificate must be dated within 03 days of the scheduled date of the passenger's departing flight and remains valid for the entire journey.

MEDIF Forms:

- MEDIF forms must be filled and submitted to Alliance Air 24 hours before onset of travel.
- Company Doctor will validate the MEDIF form and will revert back to the passenger and Station Manager via email/Phone.

Notes:

- Expectant mother are recommended to prevent delays at the airport.
- Multiple pregnancy refers to twins, triplets etc.
- Complicated pregnancy refers to cases where on previous occasions a mother has experienced difficulty and has had a complicated delivery. Present pregnancy with gestational hypertension, diabetes, anaemia or pre-existing medical conditions.
- Doctor certificate (Fit to fly certificate) is required from the treating obstetrician, dated not more than 03 days before the date of travel.
